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1. INTRODUCTION

INDIA4EU II is an institution-based mobility and scholarship project organized by a Partnership of some of the most prestigious universities in Europe and in India. It is developed within the frame of the Erasmus Mundus Action 2 (EMA2) programme, a cooperation and mobility scheme funded by the European Commission with the goal of promoting the exchange of persons, knowledge and skills at the higher education level.

INDIA4EU II is one of four projects selected by the European Commission in 2012 under call EACEA/42/11, Action 2, Strand 1, Lot 11, and is aimed to the following target country: India.

The project provides scholarships for students, researchers and staff from India in order to study or carry out research, training or teaching at one of the European partner universities. Students and scholars can choose from a wide variety of academic fields at different levels of study (Undergraduate, Master, Doctorate, Post-doctorate and Staff) offered by the European partner Universities.

The scholarships will contribute to cover the expenses of the individual mobility, including travel costs, subsistence, insurance and participation costs.

Scholarships will be awarded to applicants selected by the Partnership. Candidates interested in a mobility and the related scholarship must apply through the project's online application system during the application period following the regulations described in this document.

This Call for Applications concerns a First Cohort of mobilities that will be starting on the following dates:

- 34 months mobilities should start no later than September 1st, 2013. If for any reason students start later than this date the duration of their scholarship will be shortened to comply with the duration of the project. In case a later start date is planned by a host institution in order to suit its academic calendar this information is available in the academic offer of the project published in the project website.
- Staff mobilities can start at any time during the years 2013-2016 and must end before July 14, 2016.
- All other mobilities must start no later than December 31st, 2013.

Additional mobilities will be selected in further Calls for Applications.

3.1. Number and duration of available scholarships

3.2. General eligibility conditions

All applicants must meet the following general eligibility conditions:

Nationality	Must be nationals of India.
12-month rule	Must not have resided nor have carried out their main activity (studies, work, etc) for more than a total of 12 months over the last five years in any of the eligible European countries at the time of submitting their application to the partnership. This rule does not apply to Staff and to TG 3 candidates.
Other scholarships	Must not have already benefited from a scholarship for the same type of mobility under an Erasmus Mundus Action 2 project. Cannot benefit from more than one mobility activity within the same project.

Mobility flow	Indian nationals may carry out mobilities in Europe. Mobilities cannot take place between the European, nor between Indian institutions involved in the partnership.
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3.3. Target Groups

Individuals are classified in three target groups:

Target Group	Target Beneficiaries
TARGET GROUP 1	Indian nationals who are registered or working in one of the Indian Universities member of the partnership. This status must be valid at the time of the application and during the whole mobility period.
TARGET GROUP 2	Indian nationals who are working in an Indian University not included in the Partnership, or who have obtained a university degree or equivalent by an Indian institution.
TARGET GROUP 3	<p>Indian Nationals who are in particularly vulnerable situations for social or political reasons. For example:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Candidates having a refugee status or asylum beneficiaries (international or according to the national legislation of one of the European recipient countries); - Candidates belonging to an indigenous population targeted by a specific national policy or IDPs (Internally Displaced Persons). - Candidates victims of natural disasters - Women candidates in vulnerable social political situations - Candidates whose family is in a vulnerable social political situations - Members of schedule castes / schedule tribes /Other Backward Castes <p>Disadvantaged conditions such as economic status or physical disabilities are not conditions for belonging to a vulnerable group. They are taken into consideration as cross-cutting issues under all target groups.</p>

3.4. Mobility levels and types

Candidates can apply to five levels of mobility:

Candidates to full degree Doctorate programmes who have not completed a Master programme at the time of the application may apply if they will complete the Master programme before the mobility. Candidates to exchange Doctorate programmes may not apply if they are not registered in a Doctorate course at the time of the application.
Post-Doctorate	Carry out a higher education study or research that follows a doctoral degree. Activity can include research, training and/or following highly specialized courses.	Must have obtained a Doctorate degree. Candidates who have not completed a Doctorate programme at the time of the application may apply if they will complete the Doctorate programme before the mobility.
Staff	Perform a specific work programme agreed among the home and host universities and the individual staff. Activity can include teaching, research, training or following highly specialized courses.	Must be working as academic or administrative staff in an Indian university.

Students (Undergraduate, Master, Doctorate) can apply for either exchange or full degree programmes:

Programme	Description	Eligibility conditions
Exchange	Exchange students are registered at their home university for a degree course and study at the host university for a part of that same degree. The exchange period can be one or more semesters. Studies done at the host universities will be recognized by the home university through the use of ECTS tools (learning agreement, transcripts of records). Exchange students will not normally obtain a diploma from the Host University, but this may be possible if double degree agreements exist between the Home and Host Universities. 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3.5. Fields of study

The full list of courses or programmes available at all levels at each partner University is provided on the project website with detailed information for each course or programme, including course description, specific language and academic requirements for admission, programme duration. Links to each university are also provided for further probing.

Only courses or programmes listed on the project website are available for applications.

3.6. Financial conditions

The grant holders will receive the following monthly subsistence allowance for the duration of the mobility period:

The project will cover the grant holders' travel costs within the total limit of 2,000 euro per grant holder.

European Partners will provide their incoming grant holders with round trip travel tickets from the home country to host country. Travel itineraries must comply with the following rules depending on the target group: the location of origin can be either the location of the home institution (TG1), the place of origin (TG2/TG3) or the place of residence (TG3). The location of destination is always the location of the host institution.

European Partners will reimburse their incoming grant holders for the following additional travel costs if directly incurred by the grant holder: visa fees; local transportation for reaching the host university by the most economic means.

The Partnership Coordinator will provide the grant holders with a full health and accident insurance coverage at no cost. The insurance scheme will comply with the European Commission regulations on "Minimum insurance requirements" and will also comply with the requirements for obtaining a visa for European countries ("Schengen visa").

Grant holders at any level will not be required to pay any fee or cost to their host university for the duration of the mobility (including tuition and/or registration fees, additional library, student unions, laboratory consumable costs, residence permit, language courses costs). Exchange students (Target Group 1) will continue paying their tuition and/or registration fees at their home university and the hosting university must apply a fee waiver policy. The project provides funds for participation costs that will be used by the Partnership to partly compensate the host universities for fees and other costs.

4. SUBMISSION OF APPLICATIONS

Applications must be submitted online through the application system provided on the project web site during the application period.

Every applicant has to submit 1 (one) application only. The application will allow for a maximum of 2 (two) programme choices to different Universities. Each choice will be considered as a separate and independent application the first of which is the main application and the second is accessory. Each of the two applications is managed independently in the application database and in the selection process.

The Partnership is committed to evaluate only the main application (first choice). Accessory applications (second choice) are evaluated at the discretion of the host university on the basis of every university's criteria.

Before applying online, applicants need to:

- Check the eligibility criteria listed in chapter 3. Eligibility will be verified on the basis of the documents uploaded with the application. Non eligible applications will not be evaluated.
- Identify their target group and mobility level, with the support of the Target Group and Mobility Level Selection Guide that can be downloaded from the project web site
- Check the available scholarships and their duration.
- Choose the host university and the academic programme among those offered at the host university and listed on the project web site.
- Check the language of the chosen programme at the host university and be aware that they must have sufficient knowledge of it.
- Check the academic requirements and the admission conditions at the chosen host university and for the chosen programme.
- Prepare their academic background information, as it will be required to provide it in the application. It is compulsory to provide data on the most recent academic history, e.g.: Home Institution name and location, name of the last programme/degree attended, average mark, start and end dates of the programme.
- Prepare the compulsory documents that must be uploaded with the application. All documents must be in the pdf or jpg format. All certificates and degrees must be stamped by the issuing institution.

When choosing the academic programme, applicants should take care of the following:

- Students: the option of exchange mobility or full degree may not be available at all universities. Applicants must consider carefully their study programme and be sure to describe in the application the preferred duration of mobility.
- Exchange students: check carefully the academic calendar of the hosting university in order to verify if the mobility period is compatible with the home university calendar.
- Applicants must provide a minimum set of academic certifications as described below. Additional certifications may be required for specific programmes as per the programme description listed on the project web site.
- The chosen programme may last longer than the available scholarships; in no case applicants will receive a scholarship longer than what is available.

The following compulsory documents must be uploaded with the application, depending on the target group (TG) and mobility level:

Note on academic certifications (All applications)	<p>Applications may be submitted even if at the moment of application the candidate does not possess some required documents but will obtain them before the start of mobility, only in the following exceptional cases:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - candidates to Master programmes not yet holding a Bachelor degree but who are going to obtain it before the start of mobility; - candidates to Doctorate full degree programmes not yet holding a Master degree but who are going to obtain it before the start of mobility; - candidates to Post Doctorate programmes not yet holding a Doctorate degree but who are going to obtain it before the start of mobility; - candidates not yet holding the required language certificate but who are going to obtain it before the start of mobility. <p>In these cases candidates must upload a Statement of Commitment (*) declaring the current situation and the commitment to obtain the required certification before the mobility within the deadline set by the host university.</p> <p>Not all host universities will be able to evaluate an application based on the Statement of Commitment. Applicants are recommended to check with the host university before applying.</p>

After collecting all the above information, candidates can proceed to apply with the online form on the project website.

When applying, applicants should be careful of the following issues:

- the form must be completed in the English language. Applications fully or partly in other languages will be discarded.
- Personal data must be provided as correct and complete as possible. The data provided in the application (family name, given name, email, etc.) cannot be changed later and will be used in all instances related to the project exactly as provided. The applicant's name must match the one on the uploaded passport.
- Applicants must provide a valid email address because all communication in the course of the project will be realised by email.
- All required documents must be uploaded and must be valid and legible. All documents must be in English, or an English translation stamped by the home university must be uploaded with them. Applications with incomplete, illegible or invalid documents will be discarded.
- Applicants must declare in the application that they comply with the "12-month rule" and to the "Other scholarships" rule described in chapter 3.2.

Candidates can add information and documents to their application in different moments all along the call for applications period. Once they have completed the form and they have uploaded all required documents, they must close the application. Only applications closed during the call for applications period will be considered for selection.

The application must only be submitted online and no hard copies of the application or of the required documents should be sent or delivered.

After the selection process, the host university may ask the selected candidates to provide one original hard copy of the application including all the attachments. Selected candidates may also be asked to provide original documents for verification at the host university.

5. SELECTION

5.1. Selection procedure

The Partnership will evaluate the applications received and will select the project beneficiaries with transparent and fair criteria, in compliance with the European Commission's Minimum Requirements for the Selection Procedure.

Applications including a choice to more than one university will be treated as separate and independent applications. In this case the Partnership is committed to evaluate only the main application (first choice). Accessory applications (second choice) are evaluated at the discretion of the host university on the basis of every university's criteria.

The selection will be done on the basis of merit and taking into account the Erasmus Mundus cross-cutting issues (gender balance and disadvantaged conditions) as well as an even distribution of mobilities among the Partners, in order to activate and foster cooperation channels among all Partners.

Applications will undergo the following screening:

- Closure check: only fully closed applications will be considered. Applications not closed within the call closure date will be discarded.
- Validation: a verification that the application is valid in relation to the target group for which it has been posted.
- Eligibility check: a check of the application's compliance with the project's administrative eligibility criteria, including the Erasmus Mundus requirements. It is performed only on validated applications.
- Academic evaluation: grading of the application in relation to the evaluation criteria set below. It is performed by the host university only on eligible applications.

Main evaluation criteria:

- Academic quality and relevance, verified through transcripts of records, diplomas, Work Plan Proposal, letters of recommendation or teaching/working experience
- Language skills in relation to the requirements of the chosen course/programme
- Motivation

Cross-cutting evaluation criteria:

- Gender balance
- Disadvantaged conditions such as disabilities and economical disadvantage

5.2. Notification and award of scholarships

The Partnership Coordinator will notify by email all applicants of the selection outcomes within three months of the Call for Application closing, whether they have been selected, they are on the reserve list or they are not selected.

Only written notifications sent by the Partnership Coordinator are official. Any other communication by other parties, including project Partners, will not be considered valid.

At the same time, the Partnership will publish the lists of selected, reserve and not-selected candidates on the project web site and will submit them to the Education Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA) of the European Commission.

The notification to selected applicants will include a scholarship offer. Candidates will be required to reply for acceptance or rejection of the scholarship within 7 calendar days. Applicants intending to accept the scholarship must sign the Scholarship Contract (sample available for download from the project web site) and send it to the Partnership Coordinator by email within said deadline.

Selected applicants having accepted the scholarship by signing the Scholarship Contract will be awarded the scholarship and will become grant holders.

Applicants in the reserve list may later be selected in case of withdrawal of previously selected applicants. In this case the applicant will be notified and will be required to accept the scholarship by signing the Scholarship Contract as above. Selection of reserves is an ongoing activity and lasts during the current cohort's starting year until the latest date for mobility start.

5.3. Appeals

As required by the EACEA Minimum Requirements for the Selection Procedure, the Partnership is responsible for managing appeals that candidates may put forward in relation to the results of their application.

Appeals must be sent in written form by the candidate to the Partnership Coordinator within 7 (seven) days of notification and must be clearly documented with well justified reasons. Appeals submitted by third parties will not be considered.

The Partnership Coordinator will reply to the appeals within 40 (forty) days of the appeal.

5.4. Start of the mobility

After accepting the scholarship, grant holders will receive detailed information on the procedures to follow to start the mobility and at the same time the Partner institutions will initiate the corresponding procedures.

Grant holders will be admitted to the host university following the registration procedure as defined by the host university. Partner Universities may not request selected candidates to undergo any further selection and are not allowed to reject previously selected candidates except in case of fraud by the candidate in the application process.

Grant holders are required to comply with the local admission requirements at the host University and will have to follow the standard individual registration procedure at the host institution.

Before starting the mobility, grant holders for exchange mobilities at the Undergraduate and Master levels will have to draft an ECTS Learning Agreement (template to be downloaded from the project web site), to be signed by both the host and home institutions.
